

SECONDMENT OUTCOMES

The Pacific region faces an increasingly complex and intersecting set of national and regional security challenges, in an increasingly dynamic international environment.

This program prepares Pacific analysts to provide objective, tailored, clear, timely and defensible assessments to inform decisions to address priority security issues.

The program covers foundations in structured analytic techniques and provides an opportunity to apply that knowledge in the workplace, as well as advanced analytic techniques and how to manage and lead assessment teams.

TRAINING OUTCOMES

- 1. Be able to undertake critical analysis and engage in informed discussions on national and regional security issues.
- 2. Demonstrate understanding of a range of structured analytic techniques and be able to apply these in practice.
- 3. Identify and apply appropriate analytic techniques to address policy questions.
- 4. Be able to analyse, synthesise and communicate complex security policy problems clearly, succinctly and objectively.
- 5. Have a broad understanding of the expanded nature of regional security issues and know where to go to seek accurate data to inform your work.
- 6. Be able to confidently provide verbal advice and present on researched topics.
- Have developed stronger networks across the region and demonstrate effective networking skills to further build meaningful professional connections across the Pacific region and beyond.
- 8. Be able to pass knowledge on to colleagues and coach them in their application of analytic skills on the job.
- 9. Be able to confidently and respectfully challenge ideas and information.



FORMAL TRAINING PROGRAM

Orientation to the region	Strategic discussions facilitated by PFC A/g Director on regional security priorities and architecture, and national security policies of Pacific Islands Countries and partners.
Introduction to strategic assessment & critical analysis	This course aims to introduce analysts to the role of strategic assessment as part of the intelligence cycle, understand basic analysis techniques, and introduce the concepts of cognitive bias and heuristics.
Structured Analytical Techniques	This course aims to build practical skills in structured analysis, with training based on research by Richards Heuer. Once complete, analysts will be able to utilise a range of structured analytic tools to research key topics and come to robust conclusions to inform their assessments. This course will build on the foundations of the introductory course.
Assessment managers course	With most analysts either mid-career professionals or likely to seek promotion in the short- medium term, this course aims to introduce analysts to managing teams of analysts. The course will explore key management concepts, assist analysts in understanding their leadership strengths/weaknesses, explore how analysis and research should operate at a team level, and how to effectively manage analytical output and operational requirements.
Train-the-trainer course	This course aims to give analysts the skills to deliver elements of the PFC training program within their national systems, including to upskill teams on strategic assessment, critical analysis, and structured analytic techniques. Upon return to national governments, the medium-term objective is for analysts to be able to work with the PFC Technical Advisor to support delivery of training in their home country, either through in-person support or in a hybrid format.



WHO ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

The Pacific Fusion Centre seeks motivated practitioners who are interested in advancing analysis and assessment skills and are committed to become part of a growing network of security professionals working in the region.

Pacific Analysts work as a team to support Centre operations. They will undergo structured training that will boost skills and analytical capabilities, drawing on their own professional experience.

The Pacific Fusion Centre provides a framework for seconded analysts to grow professionally and develop skills and experience that will benefit home agencies.

DESIRED PRIOR KNOWLEDGE / CAPABILITIES

- 1. Approximately 5-10 years work experience in a relevant government agency, including with some management experience.
- 2. Excellent written English and verbal communication skills.
- 3. Familiarity with Microsoft applications (Word, Outlook, Teams).
- 4. Demonstrates professional, accountable, collaborative and respectful work behaviours.
- 5. Curious and well-read on current affairs and a broad awareness of a range of security issues facing the region.
- 6. Experience undertaking basic research.
- 7. Experience drafting assessments or briefs for senior officials.
- 8. Strong networks across your national system and experience coordinating government efforts.

For those joining the Pacific Fusion Centre from outside Port Vila, Vanuatu, the Centre will cover the cost of return economy airfares, accommodation and insurance. The Centre also provides a stipend to cover additional costs secondees may incur. Home agencies are expected to continue to pay seconded officers' salaries and other applicable entitlements for the duration of the secondment.

SUPPORT FOR YOUR SUCCESS

National Focal Point endorsement of your application ensures you will be supported throughout your secondment, with your skills coveted on return to your national system.

Our team will ensure you are well prepared for the professional and personal elements of a 15-week secondment away from home.

You will be supported through pre-deployment, on the program, and on your return home to ensure you get the most out of the program:

Virtual pre-deployment briefings and introductory sessions (4 x 1 hour) covering logistical matters, through to an introduction to the program and professional expectations.



- Structured training coupled with on-the-job experience. Under the Technical Adviser's guidance, you will complete a number of certifications in security studies, and immediately apply your learning on the job, contributing to PFC products.
- Ongoing engagement with your home agency is encouraged, to maintain connections and ensure supervisors are aware of the skills being developed.
- We will be strengthening our Alumni engagement efforts, to ensure ongoing professional support and networking opportunities.
